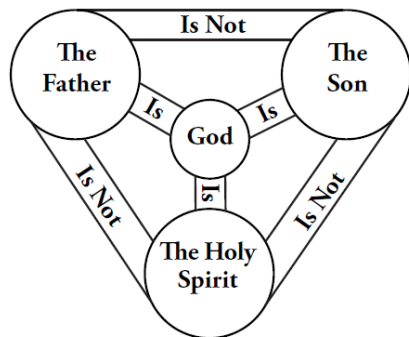
**“All hail adored Trinity,

From the Pastor's Desk

The mystery of the most Holy Trinity is the secret concerning the inmost private life of God. The Jews, chosen people though they were,

did not know that there are three persons in God. As we read in the scriptures, God revealed Himself to Moses as

“Lord,” the one great God, creator and master of the whole world. WE are privileged through Jesus to know about the great truth of the Trinity.



Because of the revelation of Jesus, we as Catholics believe that in the one God there are three persons. The first person is the Father. He is called “Father” because He is the source of life for the Son. The second person is called “son” because He receives His life from the Father. Father and Son love each other with a love more complete and perfect than we can imagine. Their love is so perfect that it is a person, the Holy Spirit. This third person, as the personal love between Father and Son, is the bond of unity or oneness between the Father and the Son. As Catholics we believe that we should pray to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In fact, if we should pray in the liturgical way, we must develop a real devotion to both God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. But we must also come to appreciate the value of praying to the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. After all, when Jesus taught us to pray, He said: “When you pray, say Our Father.” It has been said that Christianity is not so much looking at Jesus as it is looking in the same direction with Him, that is, to the Father.

And so, the Trinity is indeed a very important mystery for us, not just something to believe and then forget about. This great truth should shape our attitude toward the three persons in God and influence our prayer.

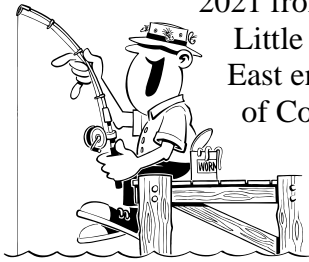
