

In today's media saturated culture we thrive on first hand reports of world news. Reporters



on the scene of war, strife and famine bring us eye-witness reports and real time videos. We don't have to believe their reports, can see for ourselves. It's a showme, prove-it, where's your documentation,

sort of world these days.

It wasn't so different for the rich man in today's gospel. The ancient reports of Moses and

the prophets hadn't been enough to convince him of the error of his ways. Left in torment after death, getting first-hand experience with the truth, the rich man begs Abraham for an eye-witness to convince his brothers.
