#### From the Pastor's Desk

Who can put their faith in words today? Nothing seems to mean what it says. Hidden meanings and messages lurk in every phrase. Even



when we discuss faith, language fails us and we find ourselves arguing bitterly over the smallest phrases, afraid of being misled, caught in some verbal trickery. It's enough to make anyone cry "I can't believe, it's all a trick!"

The Sadducees in today's

gospel knew about word games too. When they posed a puzzler about husbands, wives and who belonged to whom in heaven, Jesus could simply have said "But you don't believe in the

resurrection!" Instead, Jesus' grace looked beyond their tricks and answered the real question. The Sadducees needed to stop playing with the words of Torah and start trusting in the true Word of God. It's the same answer our society needs today. When confronted with a verbal web that threatens to trap faith in a cage of logic and semantics, Christians need to point to the true Word of God. And He will answer the need behind the words, in our hearts and the world's.
