Happy birthday to the Catholic Church! Happy



birthday to you, who are the body of the Church!

We're all familiar with our own birthdays, and we celebrate them because they mark the day of the year in which we entered this life. But did you know you have a second birthday?

Because you are part of the body of the Church, Pentecost is the Church's birthday, and yours as well. And like any

birthday, it's a cause for celebration.

The word Pentecost is Greek and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles

and their followers, and the beginning of their Earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations. Pentecost is also a Jewish holiday, which the Jews

use to celebrate the end of Passover. Jews celebrate the gift of the law to Moses at Mt. Sinai on this day. But we, as Catholics celebrate the birth of our Church.

At Pentecost, the Apostles and their followers were gathered in a room. Jews from all over the world were gathered with Peter, the leader of the Apostles and the Eleven. At this time, a great wind blew and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire, which split itself into many individual flames above the heads of all those present. The Holy Spirit came upon these people and each began to speak in tongues. Despite the fact many had no common language, they were perfectly able to understand one another.

Our insurance company will probably cover the cost of the computers so new ones can be purchased. Since the church is under 24-hour video surveillance, the police have a picture and description of the young man and will pursue the matter further. Because of the incident, the church building will be locked in the early evening or after the last meeting of the day. If you need to gain entry, please call Father Sharman. We will consult security personnel and find a method to make it easy for parishioners to use the church when it is locked.

Pro-Life Adopt a Baby Program: To help stop the anti-life push around the world, the late Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen encouraged the spiritual adoption of an unborn child. You can do this by naming and praying for one particular but unknown child's life to be spared from abortion and be allowed to continue to live. You will have the opportunity the weekend of May 28th to "spiritually" adopt a child who is newly conceived this month. Not all newly conceived babies are allowed to be born. In fact,

It also provides for them a yearly retreat and the cost of the diocesan workshop for priests. The blessing of many seminarians also comes with the high cost of educating them so they may one day serve the needs of God's Holy People.
