

From the Pastor's Desk:

In the first reading God tells Cyrus, "I have called you by your name." And Jesus says to repay "to God what belongs to God." How do we do that? We, who have been called by name by



virtue of our baptism, do this by putting God first in our lives. By loving God with all our heart, soul, and mind. And by giving him not the leftovers, but

the first fruits of our talents, our treasure, and our time. Spend some time in prayer with God today and listen to the words he writes upon your heart.

We have been chosen by God to spread his Good News in the world. We are his witnesses. Sound intimidating? Take comfort in the words from Saint Paul in the second reading: "For our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction." Is it always a "piece of cake" to be Christ's disciples in the world helping to build his kingdom here on earth? No, certainly not. But the knowledge that we are beloved and valuable in the sight of God, coupled with the power and strength of the Holy Spirit, fortifies us for the task. Are we up to the task? Yes. This Sunday is World Mission Sunday! Each year on



this occasion we — and Catholics of the whole world — are reminded that we are to be Christ's witnesses, not only day by day in our own surroundings, but to the ends of the earth. We tend to forget that every baptized Christian is a

missionary for Christ, called to spread the good news of the Gospel to the ends of the earth. As we gather next week to pray for the Church's missionary work and to support it thorough the **Propagation of the Faith**, we will affect the lives in Bangladesh...in and faith of people Ethiopia...in Haiti and Ecuador and Fiji. The world! Our financial sacrifices missionaries to call the world's poorest people to the riches of Christ: His love, as abandoned children are sheltered; His **peace**, as the suffering are comforted; His life, as all are invited to the divine life of Baptism. We know what our faith means to us, especially in times of difficulty and distress. Please be as generous as your means allow in the second collection. Many are depending on your prayerful support and your financial sacrifice to continue the mission and ministry of Jesus in our world.

Trunk or Treat: As an alternative to the traditional house to house "Trick or Treat," our parish is hosting a "Trunk or Treat" on Sunday evening, October 29th from 6-7 PM. This is a fun time for our children, and all parishioners are welcome to participate – with or without children. Cars will



be parked in the lot with the trunks open so candy or treats can be given out to the
