From the Pastor's Desk:

Patience is the virtue extolled throughout all of Advent. As we light the



second candle on our Advent wreath, the theme of patient waiting echoes in our hearts. "Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God." Just in hearing these loving words, we feel our hearts warm with solace much as the

welcoming hearth warms our bodies during these cold, dark days of winter. Saint Paul tells us to "be patient...but be ready." Saint John the Baptist echoes this with words like 'prepare' and 'repent' and 'forgive.' Patience begins here. On the day of our baptism with water and the Holy Spirit, we became God's holy people: people

who prepare God's way, ever vigilant and ready, while patiently awaiting the day of God's coming. Patience people...We know You are coming, Lord, for You are true to Your word. When it seems that You delay, help us to keep watch for You, for You will surely come.

This Advent Season, let us ask for the grace of spiritual rebirth. Spiritual rebirth is very similar to childbirth: no one can do it for you. Each one of us must undergo the painful process one step at a time. The Baptist warns us not to be like the Pharisees and the Sadducees who came but did not believe and who did not bear fruit. Instead, he bids us further into the wilderness where our souls are laid bare. His words and witness reveal the urgency and importance of the spiritual birth that is about to take place when the Messiah appears.


The Mitten Tree: Each year at Christmas, our parish reaches out to our own parish family and

Be Considerate of Others: In consideration of parishioners listening to the readings from Sacred Scripture or to the homily, or if people are kneeling during the consecration of the Mass, please wait until the congregation stands to seat yourself. Walking down the aisle while everyone is seated and listening to the readings or homily is very distracting. If you are late for Mass (which sometimes cannot be helped) or if you need to leave Mass for some reason, please return to your seat only when the congregation stands! This will help eliminate distractions during Mass for parishioners and the celebrant.

Use of Parish Kitchen and Facilities: In accordance with the norms of our insurance company, Catholic Mutual, a person must be 16 years old to work or enter the kitchen. If parishioners want to use the kitchen or other parish facilities, which you are always free to do, please reserve the space with the parish office and sign the insurance form at least one week before your event. If your event is parish related, no additional insurance is needed. If personal, you must secure additional insurance from your own insurance company or through Catholic Mutual in case of accidents or physical harm. Call the parish office for further information.
